### **Environmental Coordinator**

Allied has an immediate opening for an Environmental Coordinator located at the Hycroft Mine, located 55 miles west of Winnemucca, Nevada. This individual will report to the Environmental Manager and will be responsible for supporting the environmental compliance and permitting programs at the Hycroft Mine, as well as the statewide exploration program. Regular travel to Reno will be required.

### **Key Responsibilities**

- Assist in fulfilling WPCP obligations including, but not limited to, completion or supervision of field monitoring activities, compilation and interpretation of monitoring data, preparation of internal and agency required reports, performing facility compliance inspections, and interacting with agency personnel as required for compliance activities or permit modification.
- Assist in fulfilling Air Quality Operating Permit and Mercury Operating Permit to Construct obligations, which will include performing visible emissions observations, maintaining and reviewing facility operating logs for permit compliance, and fulfilling required reporting obligations. Job duties may also include activities relating to acquisition of new permits or modification of existing permits.
- Assist in preparation of annual external reporting, such as the Toxic Release Inventory, Annual Air Emission Inventory, or Annual WPCP reports.
- Assist in maintaining oversight of the site's RCRA and non-RCRA waste storage facilities through facility inspections, waste profiling, waste shipping, and employee training. Will also be responsible for oversight of site permitted landfill.
- Assist with investigation of environmental incidents, internal and external incident reporting as required, and directing corrective actions.

### **Qualifications**

- Candidate must possess a bachelor's degree or higher in a discipline related to environmental, mining, regulatory compliance, or applicable field. Strong technical background is necessary to ensure adequate performance. At least two (2) years experience in open pit environmental compliance or permitting is required.
- Candidate must have demonstrated safety ethic and interpersonal skills. Experience with environmental sampling and field work, analysis or monitoring, as well as strong computer skills are all desirable. Strong written and verbal communication skills are necessary to achieve productive outcomes.
- Candidate must be self motivated and have the ability to manage multiple priorities.
- Strong mastery of Microsoft Office applications is required. Ability to use GIS software is beneficial.
